Pastor's Message

Creation and Evolution: Comments based on our Adult Sunday School Class

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth......" (Genesis 1:1) thus begins the Bible. For millennium people thought the universe was created. Eminent scientists like Keppler and Newton thought the universe was created. But the act of creation requires a creator, God, and God's existence cannot be proved (or disproved) by employing the scientific method. The scientific method measures matter and God is not matter therefore scientific experiments cannot cope with the idea of creation. So they need a new theory that did not presume the presence of a creator, and in 1859 Charles Darwin proposed that new theory of the origins and development of life calling it the theory of evolution. In *The Origin of the Species* Darwin postulated that complex life forms like humans developed from simple, single cell life forms such as bacteria. This process is a natural one without guidance or direction from a creator. That humans developed into intelligent beings was a matter of chance. This evolutionary process was driven by two mechanisms, natural selection or the survival of the fittest and mutations.

Today evolution is the only theory of origins taught in the public school system. This despite the overwhelming scientific evidence of the impotency of the theory to explain the complexity of cells and life forms, and the presence of vast stores of data or information contained within cells and life forms. So why is evolution held in such high esteem? Because it remains the only cogent theory to explain how life might have naturally developed without referring to an outsider, namely God (or an intelligent designer).

Evolution, as a philosophic theory, also fails on a second front by denigrating the value of human life. According to evolution human beings, although complex and intelligent life forms, are simply the chance products of a natural and undirected process. We have no more value than any other life form. We eat we drink, we live we die, we are no more. There is no spiritual dimension to life, there is no eternity beyond this life. In contrast to this theory the Bible teaches that we were created by God in His image and likeness. We are loved by God. We are spiritual beings with a purpose greater than ourselves. We live not only for time but also for eternity. This is good news and this is why I think the Bible's revelation is superior to human theory.

A letter from Bob & Cheryl......... We miss all of you. The church we attend here is fine and the people are very kind, but it is not the same. It is wonderful news to that new people have joined the congregation—we are confident the Lord will continue to bless you and the church!

We had been warned in advance language school would be difficult. However, we under estimated the strain it would place upon us. School has impacted our health, marriage and overall outlook on life. I am sure most people would think, "oh my, living in Francethat sounds wonderful.' The problem is unless you are fluent in French, the challenges wear on you. We have a great coordinator at SIM. He told us to relax and not worry about French. He said our health, marriage and walk with the Lord were more important. The Lord has sent little reminders of what are the important things, but it is hard not get swallowed up in the pressures of the classroom.

We had a brief visit with my daughter who lives in Seattle and my son who lives in San Francisco. Neither of them had been to France. The Lord has always been gracious to me.
