During this season Pastor Tim will be preaching a series of messages on the life of Luther and several other Reformation leaders. 


Don't forget to bring food items. Fall and winter is when so many neighbors and neighbor children suffer the most. They need hot

Our Missionaries

"We (Bob & Cheryl) arrived in Niger in the very early morning hours of July 19th during a torrential rainstorm. The airport used its generators to illumine the landing strip but the interior of the airport was dark, so it took a while to get inside as we waited for the guard to check each person's ticket with a flashlight. We used our cell phone to illumine the forms we needed to fill our upon our arrival. Fortunately, the power was then restored and we were able to get through the security check without difficulty."

"We have found a church we call home, where the sermons last an hour and service between two-and-a-half to three hours. The worship music is incredible with a definite African air that makes Bob want to sit in the Africa worship section in heaven. We have begun working at the Sahel Academy and hopefully changing the lives of the students here."

"Bob is teaching 6th and 7th grade Bible and making sure they understand the importance of Christ and His death on the cross. He is also teaching 7th grade science. Cheryl is teaching cooking to the middle school kids and high school kids. Cheryl also is helping in the library."


