My Father-in-law, Roger VanDellen, liked to play golf, so when we were together he'd often arrange for us to go golfing. Roger was perpetually happy and engaging, to the point that it would rub off on me, old sourpuss that I am. Roger was also adept at engaging people in conversation. Add these three together and you get a scene where the two of us would go to the golf course, get matched with another two-some, and soon Roger was engaged in conversation with them, laughing and earning their trust. He'd ask where they lived, what work they did or had done, and finally he'd ask what church they attended. Most often the answer was, "None," to which he would proffer a pained reply, "Oh, that's too bad!" Then he would enthusiastically continue, "Church is wonderful and knowing the Lord and walking with Him through life is the greatest experience I have." Roger could say this in a non-threatening manner that would earn the respect of his listeners. He was an inspiration and role model to me. My own Father came out of a home where there was no church but his Mother read the Bible to him and shared her faith with him. Years later when he proposed to my Mother her condition was that he commit his life to the Lord and join the church. He did just that and his faith pervaded all of his life and values and served as a role model for me.

Today I thank God for my Father and my Father-in-law, who have shaped my life. This month is All Saints Day month on the church calendar. The culture observes it as "Halloween" which is short for "All Hallow's Eve" meaning All Holy Ones' (Saints) Evening (the evening before the Saints' day). For Christians this day is not about ghosts or goblins. It is about the saints who have gone on before us whose lives inspired us in our faith walk.

At Emmanuel we will observe it by reading the names of your loved ones who have gone on before us and tolling the bell for each one. I will also be telling the story of one of the saints whose life inspires our faith in Jesus as Lord. This month we will also celebrate Reformation, the work of God through His people, especially Martin Luther, to reform the teachings of His church. I will be telling a Martin Luther story too.

Operation Christmas Child—2016



Did you know that we are one of 11 countries that participates in OCC? They include Austria, Australia, Canada, Finland, Germany, Liechtenstein, New Zealand, Spain, Japan, the United Kingdom and the USA. In 2014 there were a total of 10,440,333 shoesboxes sent internationally. Of these boxes 7,991,643 were collected in the USA. Just in the Northwest alone we collected 263,348. Our boxes from the Northwest were sent to one often processing centers. Our boxes went to California. The boxes collected in the NW in 2014 went to Bangladesh, Indonesia, Peru, Philippines, Nepal and Mexico. Looking at the pictures on our display board you can see how excited and happy our gifts made these children. Along with our gifts it is wonderful to know that each child receives “The Greatest Journey”, a child discipleship program developed by Samaritan’s Purse. These children will receive the greatest gift of all , the love of Jesus Christ. This year our Emmanuel Childcare Center is joining with us in packing boxes to send to children less fortunate.

Bob and Cheryl attended the Pre-Field Orientation training at Houghton College in upstate New York in June. This training is prepares them for the challenges of working in an international school overseas. “While at the PFO training we were blessed to meet five other people who will be serving at the Sahel Academy. One of the things that struck us while at PFO was out of the over 100 participants in the training, most of them were going to Asian countries. There were a number serving in Africa, but we were the only two participants going to Niger as teachers. The need in Niger is huge.” Many of the students in Niger do not speak English. Many of the children have not learned respect for their teachers. “Please pray for the teachers and children that despite the language barrier, God’s love will be shown.”

Prayer for financial partners. Pray for God to provide people willing to support us in His work in Niger. We need the equivalent of 111 people to give \$50 a month to meet our support needs so that we can alleviate some of the desperate need for teachers at Sahel Academy.

Praise for God’s continued teaching in our lives. As we go through the process of raising support; God continues to teach us about loving people and praying for and with them. We are grateful that god has given us this opportunity to continue to grow in wisdom and faith.

Praise for God’s continued provision. We are almost at 20% of our launching fund (start-up costs). We are excited about how God is providing for His work in Niger and seek His continued provision for both our launching fund and monthly support.


