But Mary stood weeping... saw Jesus ...and then went evangelizing!

John 20: 11-18; Matthew 28:18-20; John 3:16-20)

"¹¹ But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb, and as she wept she stooped to look into the tomb; ¹² and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had lain, one at the head and one at the feet. ¹³ They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "Because they have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." ¹⁴ Saying this, she turned round and saw Jesus standing, but she did not know that it was Jesus. ¹⁵ Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom do you seek?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." ¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rab-bo'ni!" (which means Teacher). ¹⁷ Jesus said to her, "Do not hold me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to my brethren and say to them, I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." ¹⁸ Mary Mag'dalene went and said to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her."

Happy Easter Season brothers and sisters in Christ at Emmanuel Lutheran Church! I want to share a portion of Scripture that describes the Lord's plan to keep blessing us in the Church which He has built, and is building here at Emmanuel! I add the verses for this Newsletter article, that I read to you and preached about for Easter Sunday April 9th, 2023; At that time I said that Jesus showed the first and best impulse of His calling; to seek and to save the World by loving the World so much. dving for our sins on the Cross, and then after He was raised from the dead, to call us to make disciples and baptize in God's Name, and teach others in the power of His Holy Spirit. What He did was to call Mary by name, encourage her by disclosing that it was Him who was now with her as risen again, and then sent her with his own Word (calling her to reach out to others), and go tell the disciples that she had seen the Lord! Jesus mission purpose to seek and to save that which is lost, and those who are living in darkness, has been, is and will be in effect for all those who believe in Jesus, repent, and proclaim the Name of Christ to the world (that means all people). Both His calling and the power of His Word, (ie. His promise for salvation, forgiveness and strength as we proclaim His Word) is the power of the gospel for salvation(Rom. 1:16-17); and to make disciples of all nations (Matt. 28:18-20). This is and will be our new life and our new norm of how we live together and serve in this world. The specifics would continue to be given in the command of Christ to go, make disciples... and to, "baptize them in the Name of the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you". Luther and Lutherans—Part Seven

REVOLUTION OF WORDS AND IDEAS. While in exile, Luther quoted James 5:16 to prove that the biblical idea of confession was something Christians can do with one another. So, it wasn't necessary to abide by ecclesiastical strictures insisted on by the Church. Luther felt confession must not be mandatory but rather, should be something Christians could do when they felt the need. Another bombshell was when he made it clear that the necessity of celibacy for priests was not biblical. Also, separating priests into a special caste apart from lay people was unbiblical. Therefore, the idea that only they and not the lay people should take the bread and the wine during communion was wrong. It was obvious to all that Luther was concerned more about the people than about the correctness of the theology. Luther's ideas were not only radical to the Church but, also to some lay people as well. The radicalness of hearing one's own language (not Latin) spoken by the priest at the holy culmination of the mass was probably shocking for some in the pews. It was during these "writings" that Luther rejects the name

"Lutheran" which was being taken by many who sided with him. He wanted people to simply call themselves "Christians", saying, "How then should I, poor stinking maggot-fodder that I am, come to have men call the Children of Christ by my wretched name"? It was at this time also that Luther was beginning to consider the issue of "God's Will" and the concept of "Free Will". He wrote, one must allow God the freedom to do what He wished to do. But to force things by dragging one's own dead flesh into what ought to be done only by the Spirit of God was to play into the hands of and do the work of Satan.

When You Get a New Rig You Need to Learn how to Use All of It's Features



Getting old is not for sissies and the Lord continues to teach us important lessons in unique ways. Do you think God has a sense of humor that He sometimes uses to get a point across or teach us something? I think so.

Carl and I are trying to adjust to our current medical situations and old age in general. I am struggling with my recent diagnosis of widespread peripheral neuropathy because of falling too often and he to upgrade from my quad cane to a 4-wheel walker for the rest of my life. The first thing had to do was figure out how to put two walkers in the car every time we go somewhere in it. Both of them do not fit in the trunk of our car. I also had to rearrange furniture in the house so we could both use walkers in the same areas.

We have had to get used to a new routine because of these changes. It takes practice. The first time I used my "all terrain" walker was at one of the Lenten services at church. As we left I put my purse on the ground and put my walker in the back seat. I got in the front seat and was talking to Carl. Carol Henning and Pastor Gary came out and it soon became a "God moment". Carl has asked Carol about some muffins and she was bringing him some of them. She saw my purse by our back tire and said "Do you want your purse?" I thought I had put in in the backseat. It would have been ruined along with everything in it if she had not seen it because we would have run over it!

The next day we were headed to the Thursday morning Bible study. I told myself that I would not repeat my mistake from the previous day. I grabbed my purse off my walker and put it in the front seat. I turned to do the same thing with the plastic bag with our Bibles in it. I found it about a yard away hitching a ride on the seat of the runaway walker that was slowly gaining speed as it took off on its own adventure along our sloped driveway. It took the path of least resistance and sped to the street which is on a steep hill. I tried to reach our Bibles but realized, as I almost fell on my face, that I was helpless to do anything but I had to chuckle because it was also so hilarious. Anyone, like God or our neighbors seeing this would see the humor of it all, my frustration, and also be powerless to help in time! The runaway walker finally hit a mailbox post and then the curb of a neighbor's driveway and turned over and laid there. My poor balance would not allow me to go get my walker so I made my way back to the car. Carl was already behind the wheel on the drivers side so I asked him to open the trunk so I could pull out his walker and asked him if he could go get our Bibles and the two walkers.

Carl took his walker, went to get the other one, and picked up the bag and the Bibles on the way up. I was glad he had better balance and mobility to be able to go and retrieve everything.

As I look back over the incident, I realize that none of my other walkers have taken off on their own so I was not expecting that to happen. But this one has special "all terrain" features which allow it to go anywhere so I've concluded that if you have a new fancy rig you have to take more precautions. God wanted to teach me that "SOMETIMES I HAVE TO BE CAREFUL AND PUT ON THE BRAKES! LESSON LEARNED LORD! No people, animals, cars or homes were harmed during this accident but the runaway walker got a few "battle scars" from its adventure.

Tax Avoidance

If you are at an age where you are required to make withdrawals from your IRA (and are in compliance with Leviticus 27:32), consider the following, If you ask your financial advisor to send a monthly check directly to the Church to be deposited into the Church account then you are meeting the requirement to withdraw from the IRA while avoiding the tax as an "added" income. Of course, that means you can no longer claim that amount as a contribution. However, because of the liberal allowances the government currently has built into the tax laws for various contributions, you will still be coming out ahead while perhaps, remaining in a lower tax category. Plus, you will no longer have to write a check to the Church each month for your tithe.

In addition (just so you know); It is the policy of ELC that all tithe and offerings to the church are strictly confidential. That information is entrusted specifically to your elected financial secretaries who count and record the income and make bank deposits in behalf of our congregation.

Notes From James

Members of ELC recently completed a study led by Pastor Rob of the book of James (brother of Jesus). As I often do-I took notes. And, some of those notes I would like to share with you: (1) Works are both behavior and our public witness– James however did not believe in works righteousness, (2) James, to me is a kind of guidebook for Christians.
