Pastor's Message

God is at Work at Emmanuel

3.) Our relationship with Olympic Lutherhaven campground continues to thrive. We had a strong turnout for a workday earlier this summer, and enjoyed our annual Emmanuel Picnic there at Wildcat Lake this month. In addition to the work done by our group of volunteers, our very own Teresa Prange served as the assistant chef during the Youth Bible Camp during the Week of 29 July through 3 August.

4.) In August we will be formally receiving several new members who are joining our congregation. With scores of congregations wo choose between, they prayerfully chose to become members of our church.

One more sign of our Lord's active guidance is the continuing diligence of our Church Council and Call Committee, as they conscientiously seek the Lord's leading for the years ahead. And , looking ahead, we need not worry or be anxious. As Corrie ten Boom reminded us, in words that could echo those with which I chose- we know the God we follow is trustworthy. Take comfort and hope in the true declaration of Martin Luther, who wrote, "I know not the way God leads me, but well do I know my Guide."

On Sunday, July 31st, Rev. Gary Koutsopoulos and his wife, Laurie visited with us for a time of fellowship and discussion. Pastor Gary who currently lives in Snohomish obtained an AA in Biblical studies at LBI; a Bachelor of Arts degree in Religion at Christ College Irving/Concordia and a Master of Divinity at Luther Northwestern Theological Seminary. He has served as Associate Pastor at the Mission Lutheran Church, Laguna Niguel, (1994-1999); as Redevelopment Pastor at Prince of Peace Lutheran, LaMirada, CA (1999-2001); as Pastor of Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Pineville, OR (2001-2006) and as Pastor of Glendale Lutheran Church, Burien, WA (2012-2016). Since that time, he has served in a capacity similar to that of Pastor Rob. Pastor Gary was recommended to ELC by the Presiding Pastor, AALC. The Council/Call Committee has scheduled a Congregational meeting on September 18th to consider extending a formal call. The meeting has been be rolled back to September depending on availability and the call selection process. Mae has been affiliated with Emmanuel since the 1940's She remembers attending Emmanuel with her family, the Wuethrick's before she was married in 1950. Her parents were very involved in the church for many years. Mae married a sailor (Cecil "Mac" McConnell) and lived all over the USA. Cecil retired from the Navy in 1967, but his final year he was assigned to a ship and Mae with 3 teens in tow, moved to Bremerton. They



started attending Emmanuel almost immediately. All three McConnell children were confirmed by Pastor Orville Crawford. (An interesting bit of trivia... Cecil was baptized by Pr Crawford at a Seattle church.)

Mae's parents, Walt and Hazel Wuethrick, were very involved in Emmanuel's ministries. The Wuethrick and Stouffer families were close friends.

Two of Mae's favorite hymns are "In the Garden" and "What a Friend We Have in Jesus."

There were three children in the McConnell household. They were Bob, Patti and Miki. The years 2019 and 2020 were tough years for the family. Bob died Christmas Day 2019 of pancreatic cancer and Patti died December 4,

2020 from coronavirus. As you can well imagine, December is a hard month for them. Mae has three grandchildren plus two grandchildren-in-law: Ray (Kristie),

Jason and Andrea (Sam). She also has four great-grandchildren Alina and Leah (Ray's and Kristie's) and Emma and Tom (Andrea's and Sam's).

Currently Mae is retired and mostly homebound. However, when her children were pre-teens and teenagers she was a working mom. When Cecil was stationed at Pt. Mugu in Califor-



nia, she worked at the day care center located on base. When the family moved to Bremerton, she went to work at the Navy Exchange at PSNS. She managed the Sporting Goods Department. Her husband, Cecil, was and avid target shooter and hunter. Both husband and wife would shoot trap at the Bremerton Trap and Skeet Club. She became quite knowledgeable about sporting goods. She was chosen to manage the Navy Country Store when it was built.

Mae went to live with her daughter, Miki, and son-in-law, Jim, September of 2015 (one year after Cecil died, which was on

September 29, 2-14. She loves to read and spends most of every day reading and enjoying the wild life "shows" put on in their backyard (deer, coyotes, bobcat, turkey vulture, black bear, squirrels, chipmunks, raccoons, birds of every feather, etc have all visited them.)
