In the presence of this congregation, Emmanuel Lutheran church, and before our Lord God to whom you much give an account now and the Last Day, I now ask you:

Do you acknowledge that the Lord has called you through His Church into the ministry of Word and Sacrament? **Pastor Gary:** I do

**Pastor Larson**: Do you believe and confess the canonical books of the Old and New Testaments to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice?

Pastor Gary: Yes, I believe and confess the canonical Scriptures to be the inspired Word of

God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice.



Pastor Larson: Do you believe and confess the three Ecumenical Creeds, namely, the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian Creeds, as faithful testimonies to the truth of the Holy Scriptures and do you reject all the errors which they condemn? Pastor Gary: Yes, I believe and confess the three Ecumenical Creeds because they are in accord with the Words of God. I also reject all the error they condemn.

Pastor Larson: Do you confess the Unaltered Augsburg

Confession to be a true exposition of Holy Scripture and a correct exhibition of the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church? And do you confess that the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Small and Large Catechisms of Martin Luther, The Smalclad Articles , the Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope, and Formula of Concord-are also in agreement with this one scriptural faith?

**Pastor Gary**: Yes, I make these Confessions my own because they are in accord with the Word of God.

**Pastor Larson:** Do you promise that you will perform the duties of your office in accordance with these Confessions, and that all your preaching and teaching and your administration of the Sacraments will be in conformity with the Holy Scripture and these Confessions?

Pastor Gary: Yes, I promise, with the help of God.

**Pastor Larson**: Will you faithfully instruct both young and old in the chief articles of Christian doctrine, will you forgive the sins of those who repent; and will you promise never to divulge the sins confessed to you? Will you minister faithfully to the sick and dying, and will you demonstrate to the Church a constant and ready ministry centered in the Gospel? Will you admonish and encourage the people to a lively confidence in Christ and in Holy living?

Pastor Gary: Yes, I will with the help of God.

**Pastor Larson**: Finally, will you honor and adorn the Office of the Holy Ministry with a hold life? Will you be diligent in the study of Holy Scripture and the Confessions? And will you be constant in prayer for those under your pastoral care?

**Pastor Gary**: Yes, I will, the Lord helping me through the power and grace of His Holy Spirit.

Pastor Gary: Yes, and it is my great joy and privilege to be called by God to be your Pastor-preach, teach and confess my/and our faith, through the Church, and this amazing congregation, Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Bremerton! #### Luther and Lutherans—Part Three


Issues and implications. After much searching, prayer and frustration Luther found the key which anyone could use to enter into heaven. It was by simple faith that one could accept God's grace, be forgiven and enter into heaven. Luther early on realized that even when God reached out to us in love and grace, we were so used to seeing Him as a stern judge that we denied His love, thus denying the very thing we most wanted. At fault was the church and the elitist priests. Luther challenged the People of being more a tyrant than a servant because of the use of indulgences and military power to intimidate believers. Luther felt that priests created a false distinction between the priests and lay people by reserving the Eucharist for priests only. The theology of the Church during Luther's early years as a monk had strayed far from the idea that God saved us, and implied that we must save ourselves. Luther accepted this and searched for a path to heaven-it didn't work! Luther then challenged the Church and began to realize human truth had limits and by themselves they could never reach heaven. For answers, Church leaders often turned to the writings of philosophers. But the Bible, Luther believed was entirely apart from every book in the world-it (the Bible) was the living word of God-it was in the Bible where we would find our answers for everything. Luther was hunting for the truth itself about who we are and who God is and what He really expects of us. The only way to read God's word Luther discovered was to see beyond mere words. To read legalistically and simplistically was to miss God Himself. Luther believed well intended Christians perverted Church teachings, that we were in the last days in which the Church itself would corrupt the words of our Lord. Churches that are today questioning the validity of God's word are clearly doing just that.
