Pastor's Message

Thanksgiving in the midst of a seemingly crazy world or less that perfect life: (Matthew 5:1-12)

Seeing the crowds, (Jesus) went up on the mountain, and when he sat down his disciples came to him. ² And he opened his mouth and taught them, saying:

- ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- 4"Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.
- ⁵ "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.
- ⁶ "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

Now picture yourself out on the streets, feeling like all the securities of life; food, shelter, clothing, health, family, history, and future are up in the air. It really could go either one way or another, and the truth of this fragility and fear is more real to you than it's ever been! If you had one reality you will always face, and cannot be free of in your own power, it may be the conditions on the left part of this divide: Poverty in Spirit, and uncertainty that you will travel anywhere except into the pages of hopelessness, fear and darkness (poor in spirit). What would be happening for others on the other side of this reality who have heard of and trusted Jesus of Nazareth and the words of promise – in who He is, and the Life that is available to all who follow Him, Obey Him, and believe in Him (Mark 4:19-20)?

What about those of you who have emotionally been laid low with a gutwrenching grief? It seems that you have lost your life, and your reason for living, because you have lost the loved one most dear to you? On one side of this reality, the grief may be addressed with psychology that can name your pain, and seek to schedule the steps to survive it. These are the *poor in spirit*, who rightly need help in every way and from all good and caring sources when they are so stricken with sorrow. Will these steps and resources bring them the true comfort that can hope in a life and promise beyond the grave? What is the alternative for those in such heartache?

What about the timid, *the meek*, the shy or the scared that we know? Having been told that they are better followers than leaders, and truly feel happier to be behind the scenes and not on the front stage? What will they get out of an otherwise, "dog-eat-dog" world, that looks past them many times and offers thanks or appreciation very rarely? Who will be their champion, when they have done so much and been seen or recognized so little?

Finally, what about being hungry for the truth of God's righteousness and justice? Those who ask, "who and where God is in our world" (Thirst for righteousness)? This is not just a philosophy of religion class in a community college somewhere. It is a desire to know with certainty, where God is when people need God the most? If God is real, then why would the world be, and look like it is? If God is present, loving, all knowing, and all powerful, why do so many people suffer?

When you see the reality of our lives, families, neighborhoods and world, and its needs, hurts and longings, below, how did Jesus respond to all these real-life situations?

He Announced to them, Blessed are they who (are).... For (theirs, they shall) Find Hope in God through faith and life in Christ:

3. Poor in spirit

For theirs is the kingdom of heaven

4. Mourn

For they shall be comforted

5. Meek

For they shall inherit the earth.

6. Hungry and thirst for righteousness

For they shall be satisfied

This Holiday Season, (Advent, Christmas, New Year, and moving toward Easter) take heart in the response that Jesus has given. He hears your cries, sees your suffering, feels your pain, and aches with all who are broken in spirit and body. Only He can give the true blessings that our bodies and spirit need, and the hope of life in this world today and in Him for all eternity. This is ours by God's unmerited grace and through faith in Jesus Christ, according to Scripture. This is the Gospel of hope in all seasons of life, suffering, dying, and even death itself (Romans 6:4-6). So that all those believing and being baptized into Christ, we shall live! (Mark 16:16). The Sermon

How many sermons have we actually listened to? Rather than, how many have we just sat through? Why do we have sermons anyway? What is the purpose of a sermon? Why has our Lord chosen to speak to us in-part by way of a sermon? Those of us raised in the Church just accepted the teaching of the Word delivered to us via our Pastors. Then, some of us began to doubt, to question. We didn't leave the Church or actually reject the word-we instead began to search. We searched the word, we consulted commentaries, we investigated other religious doctrines. We even enrolled in College studying Religion, only to realize that even Christian leaders who we would expect to be like minded were anything but. And then, we came to that reasonable conclusion that; If God was real, if everything in the Bible was true, then, logic demanded that somewhere along the line we would discover proof. We were looking for reason... the very evidence of proof! God knows all about our futile struggle, our search, because we are human and we are His human. There finally does come a time. His time, when we come to un-



derstand that "faith begins when human reason leave off". A time when we are really listening to a sermon and realize that while the Pastor is speaking to our minds-our reason, the Holy Spirit is speaking to our hearts. Even Martin Luther in his wisdom had come to the conclusion that he could not possibly live-up to the expectations of God. That he was doomed to fail, simply because of his own human weakness. Then, brother Martin discovered IN THE WORD, that it is God who works in our lives, it is His Holy Spirit that saves us and guides us in our faith journey. Salvation is not something we earn and being a true believer is not based on a survey of the NT and OT – it is the Holy Spirit, that still small and persistent voice that speaks to our heart...it is the will of God. So, why the sermon? Because the sermon isn't just a story or a list of rules...it's our story, our journey and God's rules.
