# Pastor's Message

#### A Time for Mourning

On July 20th of this year the Lord charted an unplanned course for my life. It was not a course I sought or desired, but it was the course that came to me. I have decided to mark this milestone in my life by observing and recording my feelings and reflections, and by sharing them with you in the forum over the next few months.

It was July 20, 2018. A milestone moment. Carolyn, my wife, was visiting our daughter and our grandchildren in Las Vegas. Early Tuesday morning I had driven her to the Airporter bus to begin her trip. After I unloaded her baggage from her car I put my arms around her, hugged her to me, kissed her and told her I loved her. It sounds like a morbid thought but I always worried, "What if this is the last time I see Carolyn in this life." I wanted this last moment to express my love for her. We said our goodbyes.

It came to be that that early morning goodbye was the last time I would see my beloved wife of 43 years in this world.

Thankfully she got to spend her last days with our daughter, Rachel, her husband, Royce, and their five children. Friday morning during that visit Carolyn suffered a massive pulmonary embolism and died later that afternoon while on the operating table. I received my first call reporting Carolyn's hospitalization at 4:30 pm. I was allowed to speak to her briefly and told her again that I loved her. "All would be okay," Carolyn assured me. I rushed home from work. We were not seriously worried at that time, but I wanted to be home where I could think clearly and pray for her. At 5:30 p.m. Rachel called to report that Carolyn's condition had declined. She was not responding to the medications and she needed emergency surgery. I again spoke briefly to my Beloved, this was to be my final conversation with her in this world. We shared our love, she was upbeat, believing that all would be well. Surgery began at about six p.m. The family gathered at our house for a vigil prayer and patient waiting. We did not wait for long. It was 6:15 p.m., as I recall, when my phone suddenly rang. The surgeon greeted me. She said they had worked as hard as they could and done all they could do for her, but it was no avail.

Carolyn had passed away.

She had died on the operating table, surrounded by competent doctors and nurses who were powerless to save her.

It was the shocking and sudden news I had feared – her unexpected death! As the surgeon spoke I could hardly comprehend her words. I was in shock. My rational mind understood that Carolyn was gone, but my heart rejected this news. I recited over and over again to myself and to the my family. "I can't believe it, I can't believe it."

The time came to call Joyce, Carolyn's dear sister. She too was praying and pacing. I dialed. Joyce answered. She was anxiously awaiting the latest report on Carolyn's condition. "Joyce," I said, "your precious sister, Carolyn, has gone to be with the Lord."

Silence.

Then, agonized cries and tears.

Those tears became the trigger for my own emotional response. My beloved was gone! I wept profusely, barely aware of my family and the grief they felt.

Thus the milestone event of the passing of Carolyn J. Cartwright, my beloved wife of forty-three years. She was God's gift to me and I shall always sing her praises. I loved her and knew she loved me.

Tears have been a central part of my mourning and my healing. They are another gift from God. Virtually every day there is memory of, or a feeling for my dear Carolyn. These memories trigger a shower of tears. I let them flow. I allow myself to feel the pain and the loss that define my new life course. As sad as I am I know the Lord, who Himself faced death at the Cross of Calvary, will sustain me. Death has surrendered. God has given Carolyn His gift of new life which is beyond this world.

I am grateful for the overwhelming support that has been shared with me from our extended family and from my church, Emmanuel Lutheran Church, and from the leadership of the AALC. Thank You.

God has a journey for us. He asks us to be faithful and grateful. I am grateful for Carolyn. I love you my Dear One and I always will. I am determined to be faithful to God even in the midst of this loss. Blessed be the name of the Lord.
