Now on Monday mornings when I am alone at the church I am reminded of the seasons of her sweet presence and I smell the fragrance of her love. I see the pew where she sat, directly behind where I sit and I recognize that this was her way of upholding me and my ministry. I love her for that.

In my mind I hear her leading singing for the Sunday School children and I hear her teaching the Bible stories to the VBS children, holding their rapt attention on her. She loved the children and she loved sharing God's Word with them.

I would return home and greet her with a kiss. We would sit side by side and share with each other how our day was. I would slide my hand over hers and we would sit in silence, reading and holding hands.

God has called Carolyn to her eternal home and me to this unplanned path. I intend on honoring Him to the best of my abilities.

jackets. Don't forget to help fill our dresser for the Pregnancy Resource Center.





































The Annual Croquet Challenge
